**Friday, September 16, 2016      Cardiology and Women’s Health**

This session will address the pharmacotherapy of arrhythmias and women’s health problems. The first segment of the program will provide an overview of the mechanisms, treatment and monitoring of cardiac arrhythmias. The women’s health segment will concentrate on hormone replacement therapy and the pharmacotherapeutic management of osteoporosis. Faculty will focus on opportunities for attendees to apply the pharmacotherapeutic principles presented to clinical case studies. The program will conclude with a discussion and a question/answer session on specialty certification.

**Saturday, September 17, 2016    Infectious Diseases and Women’s/Men’s Health**

This program will examine infectious diseases pharmacotherapy and the therapeutic management and monitoring of women’s and men’s health problems. The infectious diseases segment of the program will provide an overview of the pathophysiology, prevention, and treatment of HIV infection and sexually transmitted diseases. The women’s and men’s health sessions will address contraception, the use of drugs in pregnancy and during lactation, and male sexual dysfunction. Faculty will teach attendees to apply the pharmacotherapeutic principles presented to clinical case studies. The program will conclude with part 2 of an open discussion about specialty certification.

**Sunday, September 18, 2016    Infectious Diseases and Cardiovascular Pharmacotherapy  
Pharmacy Practice, Policy, and Regulations**

Case applications will allow participants to use the information presented to address patient-specific therapeutic problems.
